LEA Plan for Use Of Funds

1. The funds will be used to ensure the air quality in SHS is safe and effective for the students and staff.

How the LEA will use the funds it reserves under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act to address the academic impact of lost instructional time through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, such as summer learning or summer enrichment, extended day, comprehensive afterschool programs, or extended school year; ([count] of 2000 maximum characters used)

The Summit Public Schools plans to use the funds to pay for resources and stipends for our teachers to teach our summer academy program for the next two summers as well as provide students with additional support opportunities before and after school. The before and after school programs will be offered 5 days a week. Students will be grouped by skill level and provided interventions aligned to iReady. The summer program will be offered for 4 weeks in the summer 4 hours a day. The program will be designed to address individual student needs in the area of math and ELA.

3. How the LEA will spend its remaining ARP ESSER funds consistent with section 2001(e)(2) of the ARP Act; and ([count] of 2000 maximum characters used)

The district plans to spend a portion of the ESSER funds on an HVAC system for the high school as well as use the money to support multiple years of our summer academy program and after school programs. The ESSER money will also be used to help with the partnership for a mental health clinician. The remaining money is deliniated for use of extended day, extended year programs, and professional development.

4. We will use diagnostic data, real time data, and post data to measure the success and growth of the students. The district has and will continue to include all stakeholders in the process by holding regular meetings to analyze the data and discuss continued actions steps for students.
