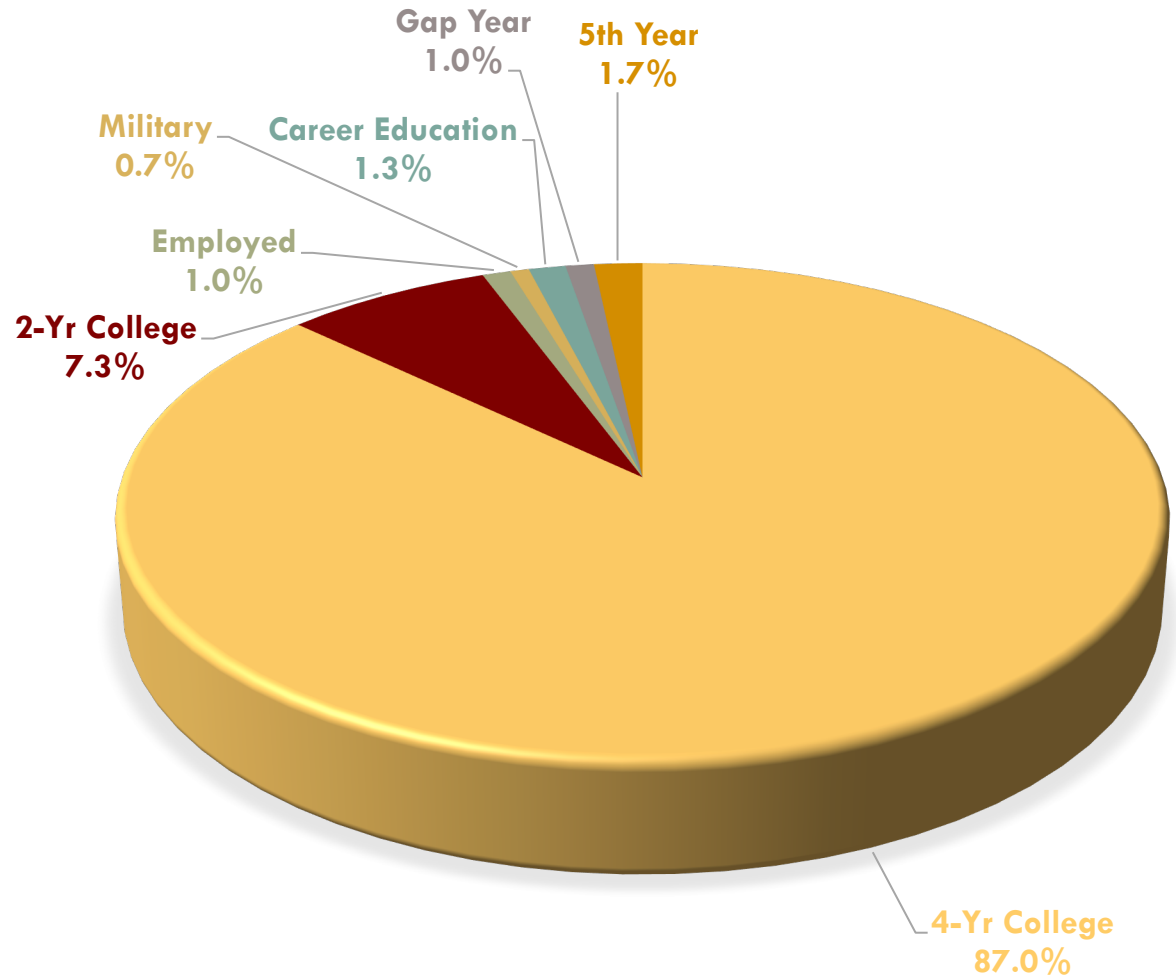

Barron's “Most Competitive” Placements

- ❑ 801 applications
- ❑ 308 MC acceptances (38.5% overall admit rate)
- ❑ 149 unique students received MC acceptance
- ❑ 104 students attending “Most Competitive” schools
 - ❑ 39.7% of 4-year college-bound
 - ❑ 36.6% of all college-bound
 - ❑ 34.6% of Class of 2019
- ❑ 115 students attend MC & HC+
 - ❑ 43.9% of 4-year college-bound
 - ❑ 40.5% of all college-bound
 - ❑ 38.2% of Class of 2019

Early Decision

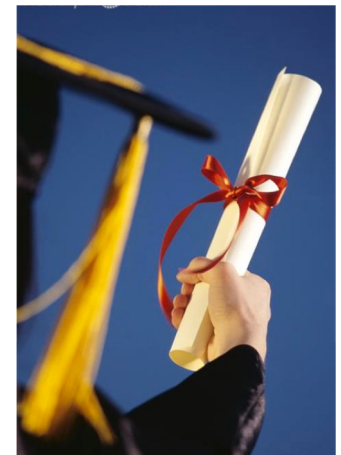
- 86 ED applications (including 7 EDII)
- 81 total students applied ED (28.5% of college cohort)
- 49 acceptances ED overall (57% admit rate ED)
- 72 ED apps to “Most Competitive” schools
 - 37 acceptances to “MC”
 - 51.3% ED admit rate to “MC”



First Generation College Students

- $n = 56$ (18.6% of class; self-reported)
- 258 applications (171 acceptances)
- 93% pursuing higher education
- 45 apps to MC \rightarrow 7 acceptances \rightarrow 3 attend

Low-Income Students

- receive Free or Reduced lunch
- $n = 47$ (15.6% of class)
- 232 applications (158 acceptances) = 68.1% admit rate
- 2- and 4-year college-going rate = 85%
- 39 MC apps → 2 acceptances → 1 attending

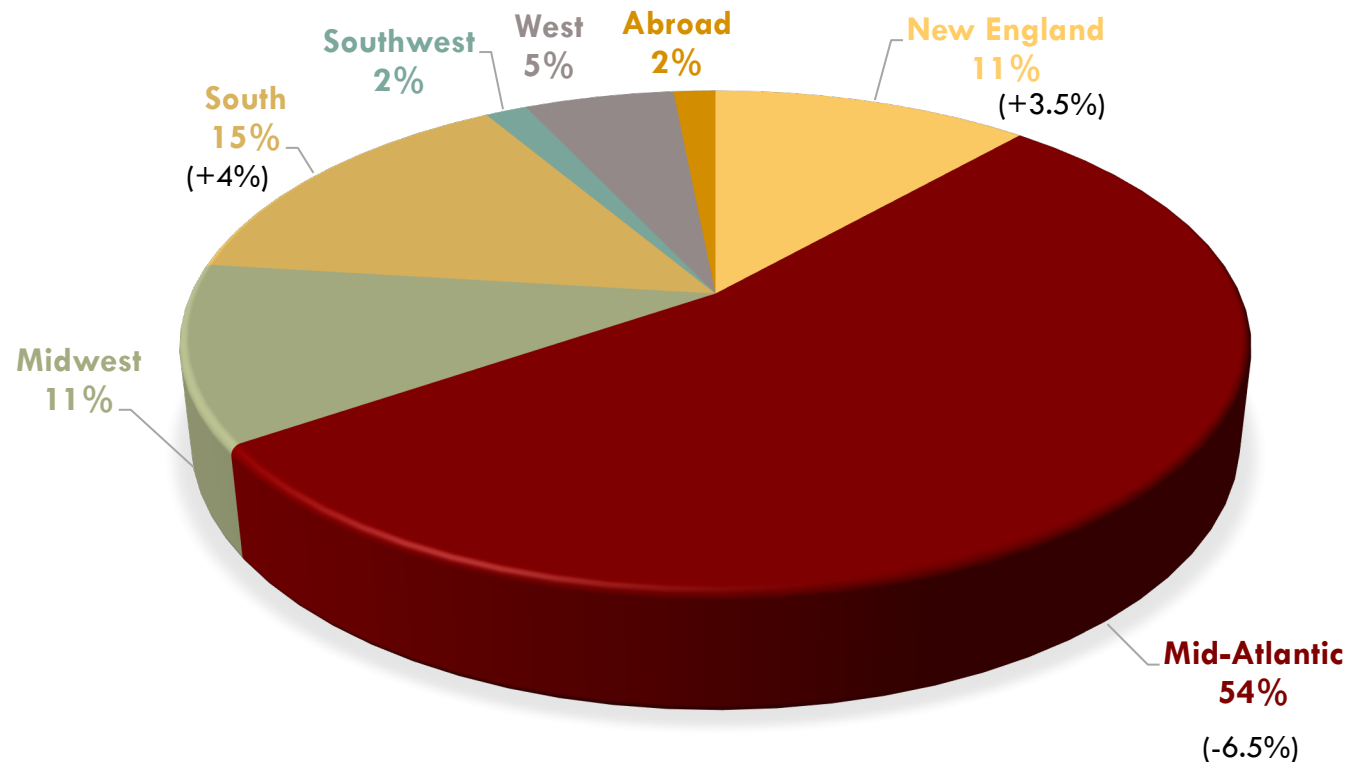
