Question

My child has a fever, but stores near me are out of over-the-counter medicines for kids. What can I do?

Answer

As a parent, it can be stressful when your child doesn't feel well. With viral illnesses on the rise (</English/health-issues/conditions/COVID-19/Pages/How-is-the-Flu-Different-From-COVID-19.aspx>) for children, parents are looking for ways to manage symptoms—including reducing fevers. And many are coming up short on locating over-the-counter acetaminophen and ibuprofen products for infants and children.



If you find yourself in this situation, stay calm: it's important to know that over-the-counter fever-reducing medicines are strictly for comfort. They won't cure an illness or shorten its severity or duration. In addition, there are several things besides fever-reducing medicines that you can do to help make your child more comfortable.

Does a fever hurt my child? Do they even need to take fever-reducing medicine?

The short answer to both of these questions is no. A fever is a sign of the body's immune system doing its job to fight off an infection. We often treat fevers in children because it helps them be more comfortable when they are sick. The good news is there are other ways to help your child feel comfortable, such as making sure they get plenty of fluids and allowing them to get plenty of rest.

What are some non-medicine methods for helping my child when they have a fever?

Encouraging children to drink plenty of fluids is key! Try giving small frequent sips of liquid or even popsicles. Dress your child in comfortable and breathable clothes and give them a blanket if they have chills. A lukewarm bath may feel nice, but avoid ice baths and cold-water baths. These will cause your child to shiver and actually create more heat.

Name brand vs generic acetaminophen or ibuprofen? What should I get if I can find it?

Generic or store brand medications have the same active ingredients as the name brand medications. So, you can give your child either one if needed. If a child is old enough, chewable tablets or dissolvable powders may also be an option. Be sure to read the label and pay attention to the dosing instructions, which are based on the weight and age of your child. You can also check these dosing charts for acetaminophen (</English/safety-prevention/at->

home/medication-safety/Pages/Acetaminophen-for-Fever-and-Pain.aspx) and ibuprofen (/English/safety-prevention/at-home/medication-safety/Pages/Ibuprofen-for-Fever-and-Pain.aspx). For example, ibuprofen is generally not recommended for babies under 6 months old. [Back to Top](#)

Also, call your pediatrician before giving fever medicine if your child is under 2 months old.

My child also has a cough. Can I give cough-and-cold medicine that has a fever-reducer in it?

Combination medications for children that are labeled to tackle a variety of symptoms including fever and cough are not typically recommended. The fever-reducing medication can be under-dosed when given this way, making it less effective. Stick to identifying the symptoms you want to help and avoid the combo approach.

When to call your pediatrician

Most viral illnesses causing fevers in children will resolve after a week. Focus on how your child looks and acts while they're sick—if they have a fever but are playful, they will likely do okay at home.

However, call your pediatrician or seek immediate medical care if your child:

- has concerning symptoms such as acting very sleepy or weak, peeing less than usual, showing signs of dehydration (/English/health-issues/injuries-emergencies/Pages/dehydration.aspx) or difficulty breathing (/English/health-issues/conditions/chest-lungs/Pages/RSV-When-Its-More-Than-Just-a-Cold.aspx).
- is younger than 3 months old and has a temperature of 100.4°F (38.0°C) or higher, even if they seem fine and show no other signs of illness.
- is younger than 2 years old and the fever lasts for more than 24 hours
- is 2 years of age or older and the fever lasts for more than 3 days (72 hours)

Pregunta

Mi hijo tiene fiebre, pero las farmacias cercanas no tienen medicamentos de venta libre para niños. ¿Qué puedo hacer?

Respuesta

Como padre o madre, puede ser estresante cuando su hijo no se siente bien. Con el aumento de las enfermedades virales (</spanish/health-issues/conditions/covid-19/paginas/how-is-the-flu-different-from-covid-19.aspx>) en los niños, los cuidadores buscan formas de controlar los síntomas, incluida la fiebre. Y para muchos está siendo difícil encontrar acetaminofeno e ibuprofeno de venta libre para bebés y niños.



Si se encuentra en esta situación, mantenga la calma: es importante saber que los medicamentos de venta libre para reducir la fiebre son estrictamente para hacer más llevadera la enfermedad del niño. No curarán una enfermedad ni acortarán su gravedad o duración. Por otro lado, hay varias cosas además de los medicamentos que pueden ayudar a reducir la fiebre y a que su hijo se sienta más cómodo.

¿La fiebre le hace daño a mi hijo? ¿Necesita tomar medicamentos para reducir la fiebre?

La respuesta corta a ambas preguntas es **no**. La fiebre es una señal de que el sistema inmunitario del cuerpo está haciendo su trabajo para combatir una infección. A menudo tratamos la fiebre en los niños porque les ayuda a estar más cómodos cuando están enfermos. La buena noticia es que hay otras maneras de ayudar a su hijo a sentirse cómodo, como asegurarse de que beba muchos líquidos y permitirle que descanse lo suficiente.

¿Cuáles son algunos métodos no medicinales para ayudar a mi hijo cuando tiene fiebre?

¡Animar a los niños a beber muchos líquidos es clave! Trate de darle pequeños sorbos frecuentes de líquido o incluso paletas heladas. Vista a su hijo con ropa cómoda y transpirable y dele una manta si tiene escalofríos. Un baño tibio puede sentirse bien, pero evite los baños de hielo y los baños de agua fría. Esto hará que su hijo se estremezca y, de hecho, genere más calor.

¿Acetaminofeno o ibuprofeno de marca o genérico? ¿Qué debo comprar si puedo encontrarlo?

Los medicamentos genéricos o de marca propia tienen los mismos ingredientes activos que los medicamentos de marca. Por lo tanto, puede darle a su hijo cualquiera de las dos versiones si lo necesita. Si un niño tiene la edad suficiente, las tabletas masticables o los polvos solubles también pueden ser una opción. Solo asegúrese de leer la etiqueta y prestar atención a las instrucciones de dosificación, que se basan en el peso y la edad de su hijo. También puede consultar estas tablas de dosificación para acetaminofeno (</spanish/safety-prevention/at-home/medication-safety/paginas/acetaminophen-for-fever-and-pain.aspx>) (paracetamol) e ibuprofeno (</spanish/safety-prevention/at-home/medication-safety/paginas/ibuprofen-for-fever-and-pain.aspx>). Por ejemplo, el ibuprofeno generalmente **NO se recomienda** para bebés menores de 6 meses.

Además, llame a su pediatra antes de darle medicamentos para la fiebre si su hijo tiene menos de 2 meses.

Mi hijo también tiene tos. ¿Puedo darle un medicamento para la tos y resfriado que contenga un reductor de fiebre?

Por lo general, no se recomiendan los medicamentos combinados para niños que están etiquetados para abordar una variedad de síntomas, como fiebre y tos. El medicamento para reducir la fiebre puede tener una dosis insuficiente cuando se administra de esta manera, lo que lo hace menos efectivo. Límitese a identificar los síntomas que desea ayudar y evite el enfoque combinado.

Cuando llamar a su pediatra

La mayoría de las enfermedades virales que causan fiebre en los niños se resolverán después de una semana. Concéntrese en cómo se ve y actúa su hijo mientras está enfermo: si tiene fiebre, pero sigue jugando, es probable que esté bien en casa.

Sin embargo, llame a su pediatra o busque atención médica inmediata si su hijo:

- tiene síntomas preocupantes como mucho sueño o debilidad, orina menos de lo habitual, muestra signos de deshidratación (</spanish/health-issues/injuries-emergencies/paginas/dehydration.aspx>) o dificultad para respirar ([/spanish/tips-tools/ask-the-pediatrician/Paginas/Virus%20sincicial%20respiratorio%20\(VSR\):%20cuando%20el%20problema%20es%20m%C3%A1s%20que%20un%20simple%20resfriado](/spanish/tips-tools/ask-the-pediatrician/Paginas/Virus%20sincicial%20respiratorio%20(VSR):%20cuando%20el%20problema%20es%20m%C3%A1s%20que%20un%20simple%20resfriado)).
- tiene menos de 3 meses de edad y tiene una temperatura de 100,4 °F (38 °C) o más, incluso si parece estar bien y no muestra otros signos de enfermedad.
- es menor de 2 años y la fiebre dura más de 1 día (24 horas).
- tiene 2 años o más y la fiebre dura más de 3 días (72 horas).
