Ms. Lorena Dolan was named Assistant Principal of Summit High School in February 2016. In this role, she is responsible for coordinating standardized testing at the high school, including PARCC and NJBCT; PowerSchool and teacher gradebook oversight; scheduling; and discipline for grades 10 and 12.

Ms. Dolan has worked in Summit since 2010 as a special education teacher at Summit High School, providing in-class support for a variety of classes and study skills. She taught in tandem with the English, Math, History and Science departments. She was a valuable contributor to the I&RS, Assessment and School Safety Committees. In addition, she served as an advisor to Student Council, FACES, and Kids Helping Kids.
