Principal, Summit High School

Mrs. Stacy Grimaldi was named Principal of Summit High School in January 2016. She is responsible for the oversight of the building, the student body and the staff.

Prior to being named Principal, since 2008, Mrs. Grimaldi served as Assistant Principal of Summit High School. During her tenure in this role, she worked collaboratively with the high school administrative team to research, develop, and analyze the implementation of the new block schedule. She also was responsible for overseeing the school's testing, including PARCC, and worked closely with administrators and the Summit Police Department to implement a new security procedure called ALICE.

Mrs. Grimaldi came to Summit High School as a math teacher in 2001, where she taught Geometry, Algebra 2/Trigonometry, Pre-Calculus, Statistics, Advanced Placement Statistics, and Java Programming. She began her career in education in 1994 at Monroe Township High School as a math teacher.

Mrs. Grimaldi is currently a Doctoral Candidate in Educational Leadership at Rutgers University. She has a Masters of Education in Administration and Supervision from Rutgers University and a Masters of Arts in Teaching Secondary Mathematics from Union College in Schenectady, NY. She also has her undergraduate degree from Union College.
