(Before school and the 1st half of lunch) *Student ID's are required to purchase a dance ticket.*

Mandatory Meeting Dates (must attend 1): Wednesday, March 4th & Thursday, March 5th during the first half of lunch in the SHS auditorium. *Please have your student ID to swipe into this meeting.*

Tickets are **NON-REFUNDABLE** and **NON-TRANSFERABLE**

The attached information sheet must be filled out and submitted when tickets are purchased. Each person must be present to purchase a semi-formal ticket. *Retain the first two pages for your records.*

No tickets will be sold after Thursday, February 26th

All fines must be cleared prior to the purchase of tickets. In addition, it is a requirement for students to attend one of the two required meetings in order to attend the semi-formal. The meetings will be held in the auditorium during the first lunch block on Wednesday, March 4th, and Thursday, March 5th. In addition, all students must be present for 4 academic hours on Friday, March 6th to be eligible to attend the event.

On the night of the dance:

- All students must arrive by 7:30 PM.
- No students may leave prior to 10 PM.
- Summit Police Officers and high school staff and administrators will meet students as they arrive.
- Uniformed officers will be in the parking lot as students arrive and during the event.
- High school administrators will personally greet every guest before registration.
- Registration/check-in will be done for each individual student by last name.
- No backpacks, bags, sunglasses, candies (gum, lollipops, etc.), water bottles, or containers are allowed in the event.
- All purses will go through a bag-check table, and all students will be asked to open their coats/jackets or shawls. Students will be asked to empty their pockets.
- No student will be allowed to leave the venue and re-enter.
- The main room, lobby, bathrooms, and exits are monitored by chaperones and police officers throughout the evening. Entrance to restrooms is limited by capacity.
- This is a non-smoking event, and all school rules apply. All cigarettes, lighters, etc., will be confiscated by school personnel and discarded. Electronic smoking devices will be handled according to the Student Handbook and District Policy.
- Any student who violates the Board of Education Substance Policy (5530) will be turned over to parents or police at the scene.

Please review the Substance Guidelines and consequences as follows on the next page:

Any violation of Board rules prohibiting the use, possession, and/or distribution of a substance is a serious offense, and the student who violates a substance abuse rule will be disciplined accordingly. Repeated violations are more severe offenses and warrant stricter disciplinary measures. Students who violate the substance abuse rules will be disciplined as follows

First offense: A three-day suspension from school;

- If the student has not received medical clearance to return to school, then the student must have an additional medical examination, verifying that the student is no longer under the influence, and physically and mentally able to perform in school, such medical verification to be presented to the Principal at a re-entry conference at which a parent or guardian must be present.
- A re-admit conference with the family, student, principal or designee, and the Student Assistance Counselor;
- Three mandatory follow-up meetings with a Student Assistance Counselor. Referral to and mandatory evaluation by a licensed alcohol and other drug assessment and treatment facility. Student must comply with treatment recommendations resulting from such assessment;
- Students who are suspended from school are not permitted to attend school events or activities, be on school grounds or attend classes during the period of suspensions;
- Up to a 14-day calendar day suspension from athletic and/or extra-curricular activities. Loss of privileges which may include but are not limited to: school sponsored events (i.e. field trips, dances, semi-formal, prom, senior banquet, Graduation), parking, open lunch, unassigned study hall. Students will not be permitted to attend any overnight field trips for the remainder of the school year. If there are any remaining suspension days at the end of the school year, these days will carry over to the beginning of the fall athletic season, if applicable, or the beginning of the school year. Leadership positions within a school-sponsored extracurricular club or activity, which may include but are not limited to team captain, editor of school publications, etc., will be revoked for the activity period of the entire school year.
- Referral to and mandatory evaluation by licensed alcohol and other drug assessment and treatment facility. Student must comply with treatment recommendations resulting from such assessment;

Second offense: A six-day suspension from school;

- If the student has not received medical clearance to return to school, then the student must have an additional medical examination, verifying that the student is no longer under the influence, and physically and mentally able to perform in school, such medical verification to be presented to the principal at a re-entry conference at which a parent or guardian must be present.
- Referral to and mandatory evaluation by licensed alcohol and other drug assessment and treatment facility. Student must comply with treatment recommendations resulting from such assessment;
- A re-admit conference with the family, student, principal or designee, and the Student Assistance Counselor;
- Four mandatory follow-up meetings with a Student Assistance Counselor;
- Students who are suspended from school are not permitted to attend school events or activities, be on school grounds or attend classes during the period of suspension;
- Up to a 30-calendar day suspension from athletic and/or extra-curricular activities. Loss of privileges which may include but are not limited to: school sponsored events (i.e. field trips, dances, semi-formal, prom, senior banquet, Graduation), parking, open lunch, unassigned study hall.
- Students will not be permitted to attend any overnight field trips for the remainder of the school year. If there are any remaining suspension days at the end of the school year, these days will carry over to the beginning of the fall athletic season, if applicable, or the beginning of the school year. Leadership positions within a school-sponsored extracurricular club or activity, which may include but are not limited to, team captain, editor of school publications, etc., will be revoked for the activity period of the entire school year.
- The student forfeits the right to any Summit High School special award or scholarship for that school year.

Third offense: The student will be suspended or expelled from school as recommended by the superintendent.

- If the student has not received medical clearance to return to school, then the student must have an additional medical examination, verifying that the student is no longer under the influence, and physically and mentally able to perform in school, such medical verification to be presented to the principal at a re-entry conference at which a parent(s) or guardian (s) must be present;
- Referral to and mandatory evaluation by licensed alcohol and other drug assessment and treatment facility. Student must comply with treatment recommendations resulting from such assessment;
- A re-admit conference with the family, student, principal or designee and the Student Assistance Counselor;
- Students who are suspended from school are not permitted to attend school events or activities, be on
- school grounds or attend classes during the period of suspension;
- Up to a 45-day calendar day suspension from athletic and/or extra-curricular activities. Loss of privileges which may include but are not limited to: school-sponsored events (i.e. field trips, dances, semi-formal, prom, senior banquet, Graduation), parking, open lunch, unassigned study hall. Students will not be permitted to attend any overnight field trips for the remainder of the school year. If there are any remaining suspension days at the end of the school year, these days will carry over to the beginning of the fall athletic season, if applicable, or the beginning of the school year. Leadership positions within a school-sponsored extracurricular club or activity, which may include but are not limited to team captain, editor of school publications, etc., will be revoked for the activity period of the entire school year. *The student forfeits the right to any Summit High School special award or scholarship for that school year.*
